



WELCOME AND WORSHIP ANNOUNCEMENT

Last week, we read about the church at Thessalonica. Today we get to hear about another church that was started by Paul. The first reading is about the time that Paul spent in Corinth. The second reading is from a letter Paul sent to the church at Corinth. Our story today is about a community of believers that were experiencing conflict. Paul wrote them a letter to help them work through that conflict and focus on worshiping and serving God together.

CALL TO WORSHIP

L: The God of all creation makes us one in the flesh.

P: Let us join hearts and voices in praise.

L: In Jesus Christ, we are made one in the Spirit.

P: Let us be united in truth through the same one Spirit.

L: We practice our faith in many different ways.

P: Yet we confess one Lord Jesus Christ.

L: We render different forms of ministry.

P: Yet our calling is one because Christ is undivided.

L: Rejoice, people of God: The Risen Christ is among us, calling us together at his one Table.

P: Praise the Lord!

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

Today we will read about division in the church. Even back in the earliest days of the church, believers created discord from issues large and small. It happened back then, and it happens now.

Let us pray: Lord God, your Holy Spirit brought the nations together as one body of your children, united to speak of your

resurrection, but it was not long before they began to argue over their differences instead of rejoicing in the resurrection. We, too, argue over our differences.

WORDS OF ASSURANCE

Hear the good news: Jesus Christ suffered, died, rose again, and ascended to heaven. This is the truth we celebrate. This is the truth we are called to share. This is the truth that offers forgiveness for our disunity. Go, be united with your fellow children of God and get to the work of telling the good news! **Amen**.

SHARING THE PEACE

Initially the Passing of the Peace was intended to be a time for believers to make peace with anyone they had wronged or by whom they had been wronged.

Remind us of those things that unite us. Help us to see past our divisions. Be with us in this worship as we explore how to work together as your church. Amen

CHILDREN'S TIME, SONG AND PRAYER: CB 20 - CARES CHORUS

FIRST READING: ACTS 18:1-4

After Athens, Paul went to Corinth. That is where he discovered Aquila, a Jew born in Pontus, and his wife, Priscilla. They had just arrived from Italy, part of the general expulsion of Jews from Rome ordered by Claudius. Paul moved in with them, and they

worked together at their common trade of tent making. But every Sabbath he was at the meeting place, doing his best to convince both Jews and Greeks about Jesus.

SECOND READING: 1 CORINTHIANS 1:10-18

I have a serious concern to bring up with you, my friends, using the authority of Jesus, our Master. I'll put it as urgently as I can: You must get along with each other. You must learn to be considerate of one another, cultivating a life in common. I bring this up because some from Chloe's family brought a most disturbing report to my attention - that you're fighting among yourselves! I'll tell you exactly what I was told: You're all picking sides, going around saying, "I'm on Paul's side," or "I'm for Apollos," or "Peter is my man," or "I'm in the Messiah group." I ask you, "Has the Messiah been chopped up in little pieces so we can each have a relic all our own? Was Paul crucified for you? Was a single one of you baptized in Paul's name?" I was not involved with any of your baptisms - except for Crispus and Gaius - and on getting this report, I'm sure glad I wasn't. At least no one can go around saying he was baptized in my name. (Come to think of it, I also baptized Stephanas's family, but as far as I can recall, that's it.) God didn't send me out to collect a following for myself, but to preach the Message of what he has done, collecting a following for him. And he didn't send me to do it with a lot of fancy rhetoric of my own, lest the powerful action at the center - Christ on the Cross - be trivialized into mere words. The Message that points to Christ on the Cross seems like sheer silliness to those hell-bent on destruction, but for those on the way of salvation it makes perfect sense. This is the way God works, and most powerfully as it turns out.

The silence was deafening - they had been arguing with one another over who among them was greatest. He sat down and

summoned the Twelve. "So you want first place? Then take the last place. Be the servant of all."




